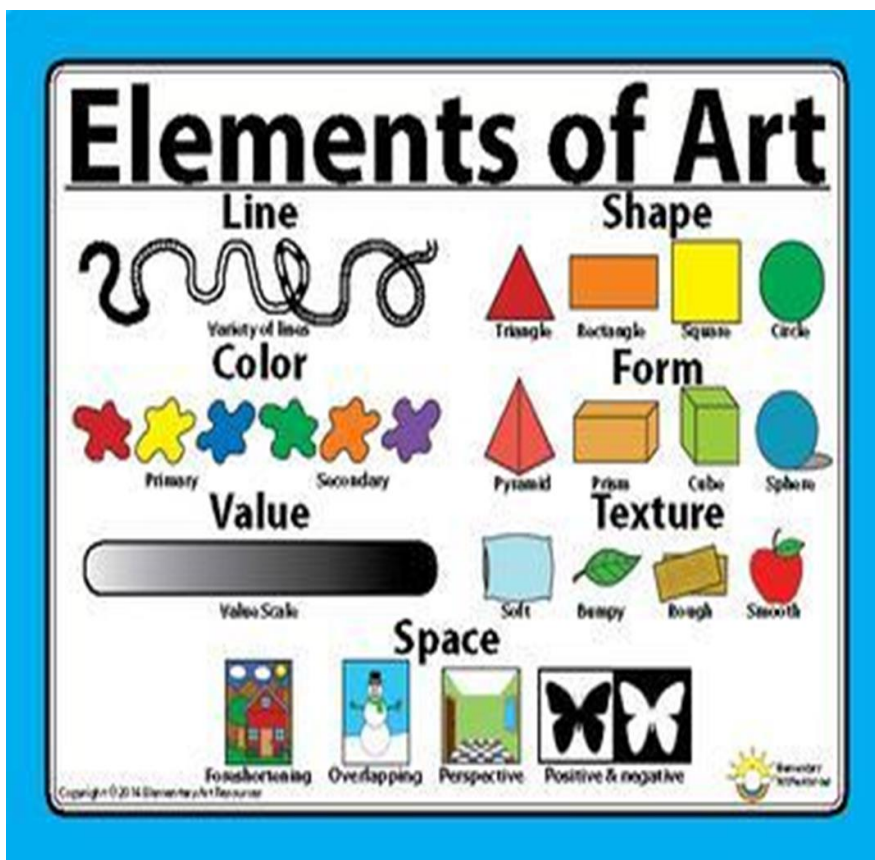

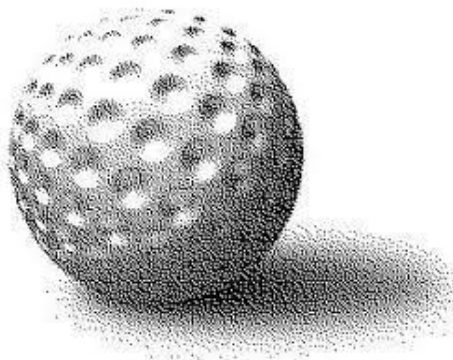

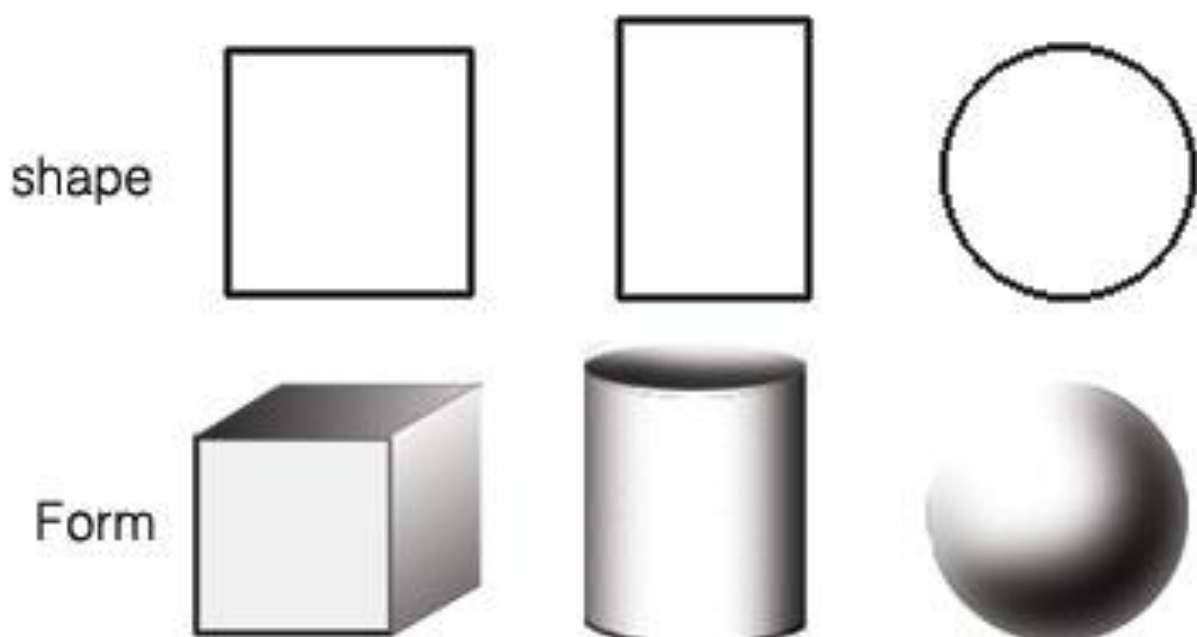
2. **Lines (line)** Lines are the basis of the structure of everything in the universe. The most important thing in designing things is that they are all composed of lines. The meaning of the word line is

4. texture (texture)

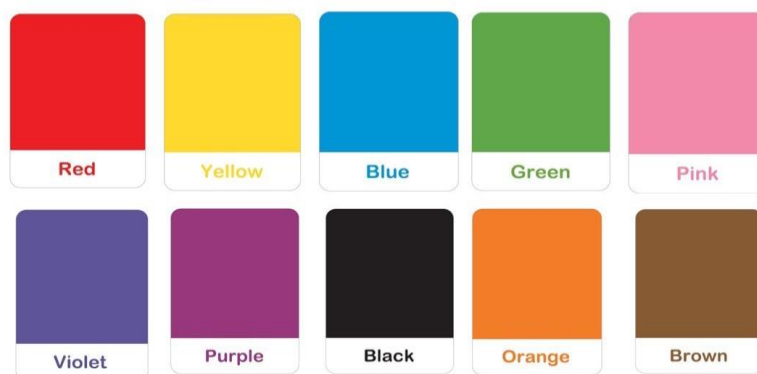

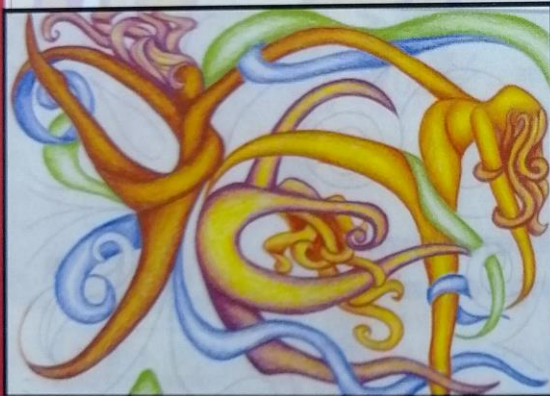
Step 1.

Step 3.

- Use the 'Harmonious colour shading' technique outlined in the **Art Know How** section to add the highlight and the shadow colours to the figures.



Step 4.

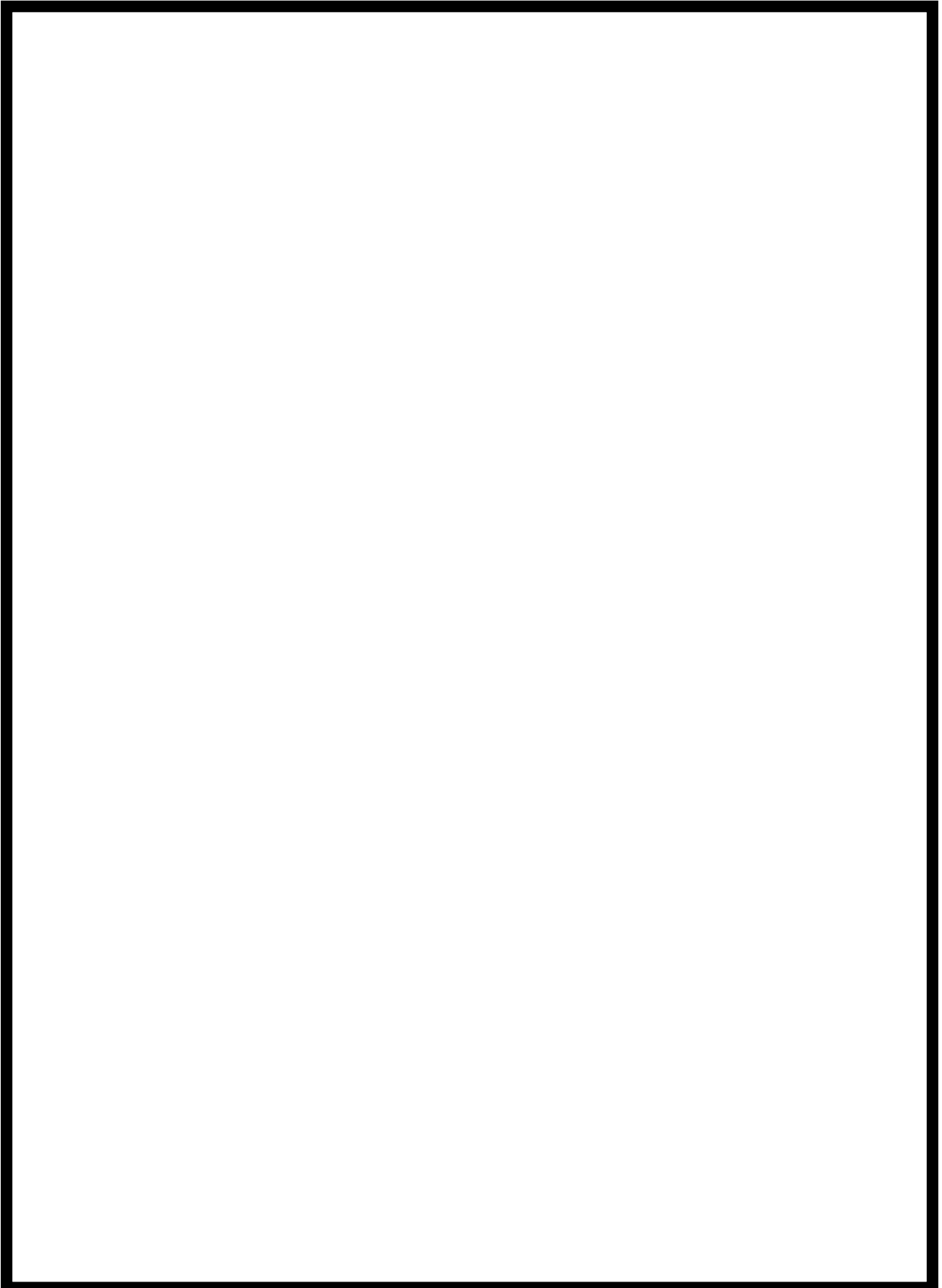
- Use cool colours in the background shapes.
- Remind students to distribute the colours evenly throughout the background to create a sense of balance in the composition.

Step 5.

- When adding water to the watercolour pencil, remind students to always start with the highlight colour and gradually move into the darker colours.

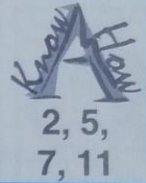

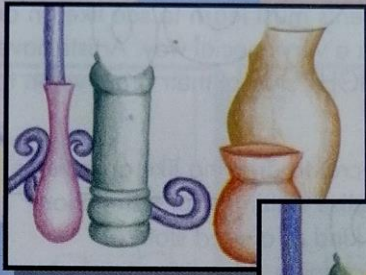
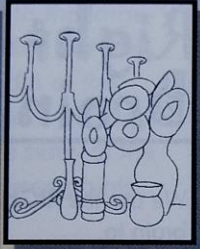

Step 3.

- To create more contrast, add the appropriate dark colour to each shape according to the 'Harmonious colour shading' scheme.

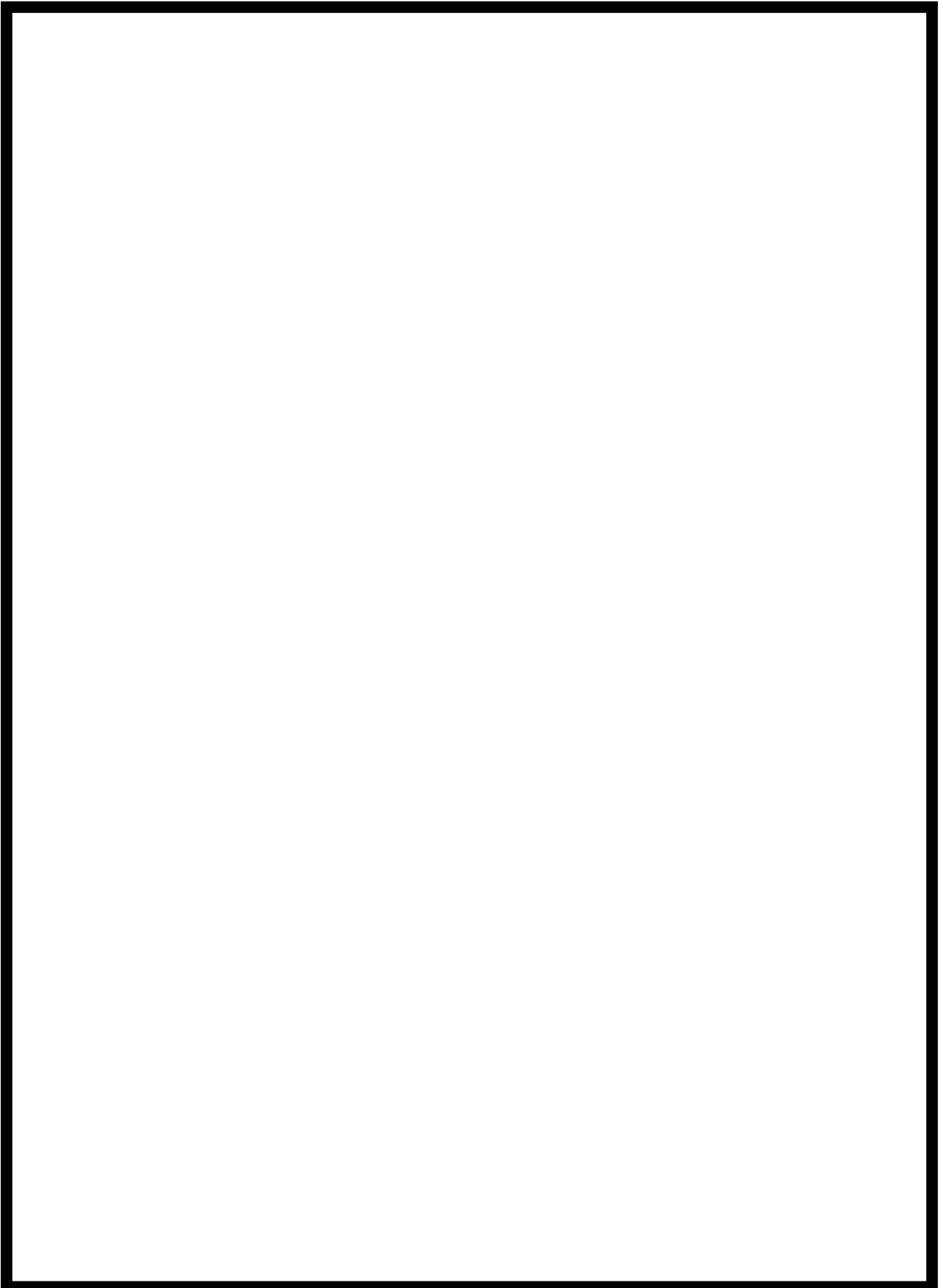


Step 4.

- Draw and colour a variety of flowers on a separate piece of paper. Cut and paste these onto the vase. Use crayons to pattern the tablecloth.
- Add water to the watercolour pencil and then layer washes of watercolour over the background and tablecloth.

Step 1.

- Use the interior drawing completed in the planning stages of this unit.



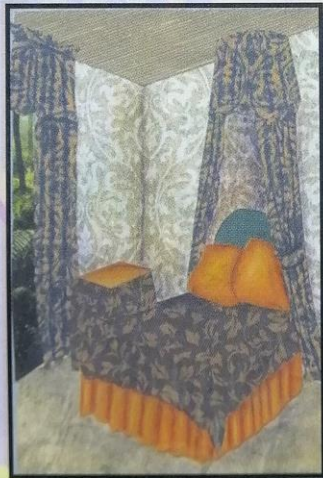
Step 2.

- Refer to the 'Collaging techniques' outlined in the **Art Know How** section for detailed instructions on how to accurately trace, cut and paste shapes from collage papers.
- Trace, cut and paste all the large background areas such as ceiling, walls and the floor to the original drawing.
- Trace out the next largest object in the room and paste it **OVER** the background.
- Continue to cut and paste the rest of the objects.



Step 3.

- Use coloured pencils to shade the collaged shapes to create a three dimensional effect.
- Cut and paste photographs of outdoor scenes in any windows.

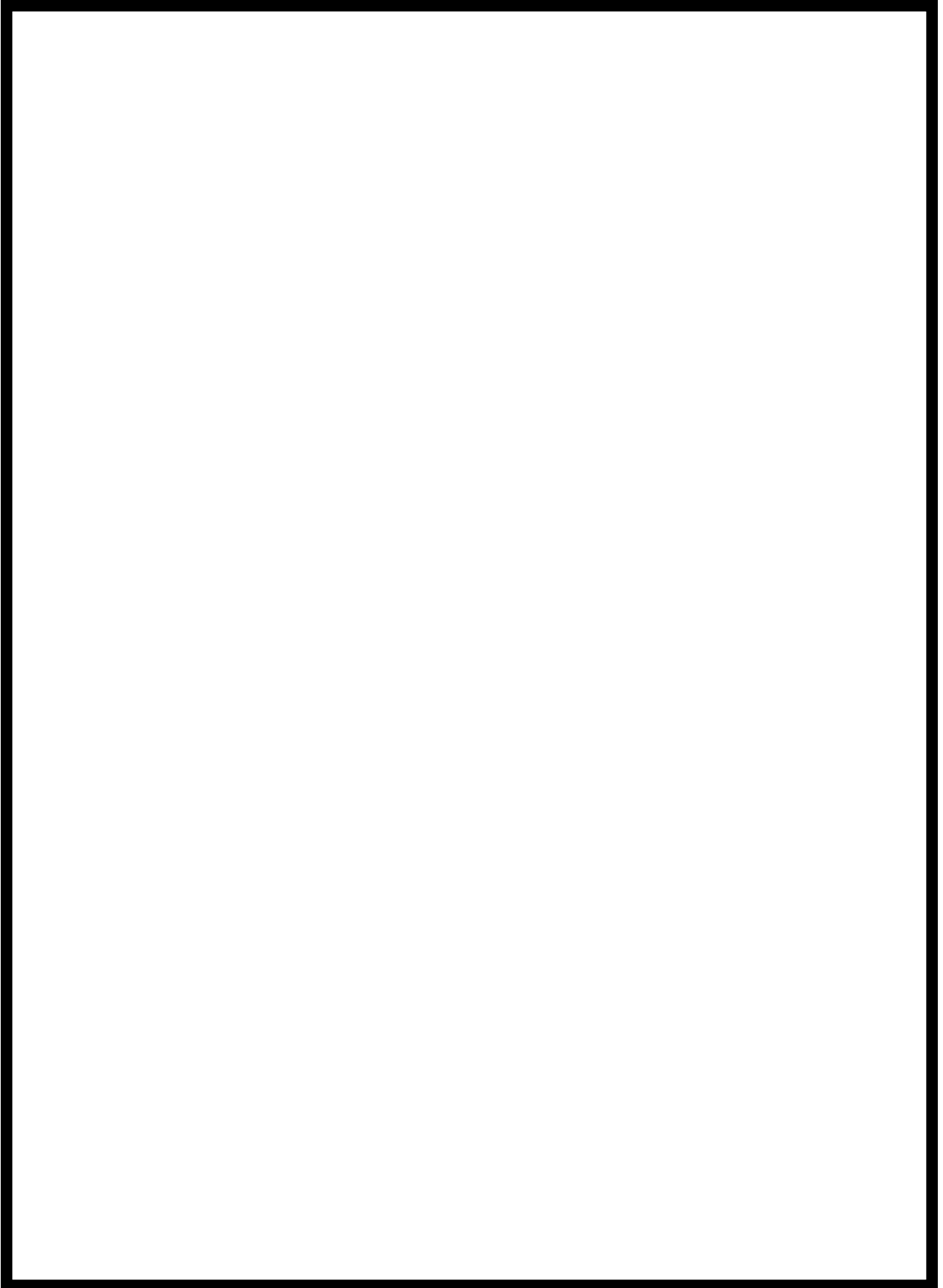


Step 4.

- Search through magazines to find a variety of decorative objects and furniture for the room.
- When pasting these photographs to the collaged interior, remind students to overlap and position large objects to the foreground and smaller objects to the background.

- Plastic cling wrap, rock or table salt & rice
- Watercolour paints and paintbrushes

- Watercolour & mixed media techniques



Step 1.

- Spread washes of watercolour paint over the paper.
- Lay a sheet of cling wrap across the damp paint and scrunch up the wrap to create a crinkled effect.
- Dab splotches of watercolour along the bottom of the page and sprinkle rock salt and rice to create a speckled effect.
- Leave the background to dry.



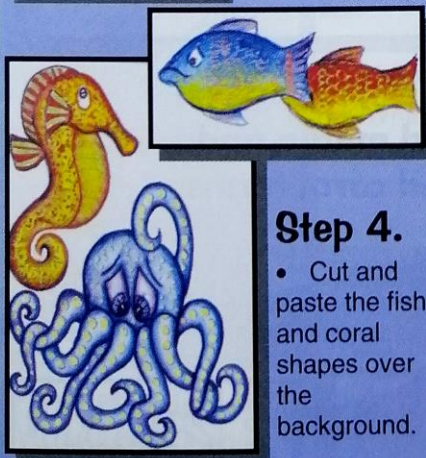
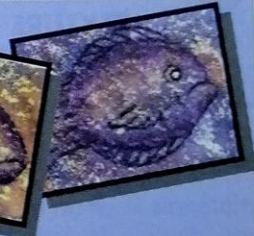
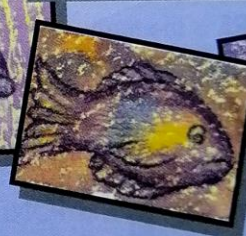
Step 2.

- To create more contrast and a three dimensional effect in the coral, use coloured pencils to outline, pattern and shade the coral forms in the background.



Step 3.

- On a separate sheet of paper, collect rubbings from textured and patterned surfaces using crayons and coloured pencils.
- Using coloured pencils, draw and shade a variety of fish and coral shapes over the rubbings.

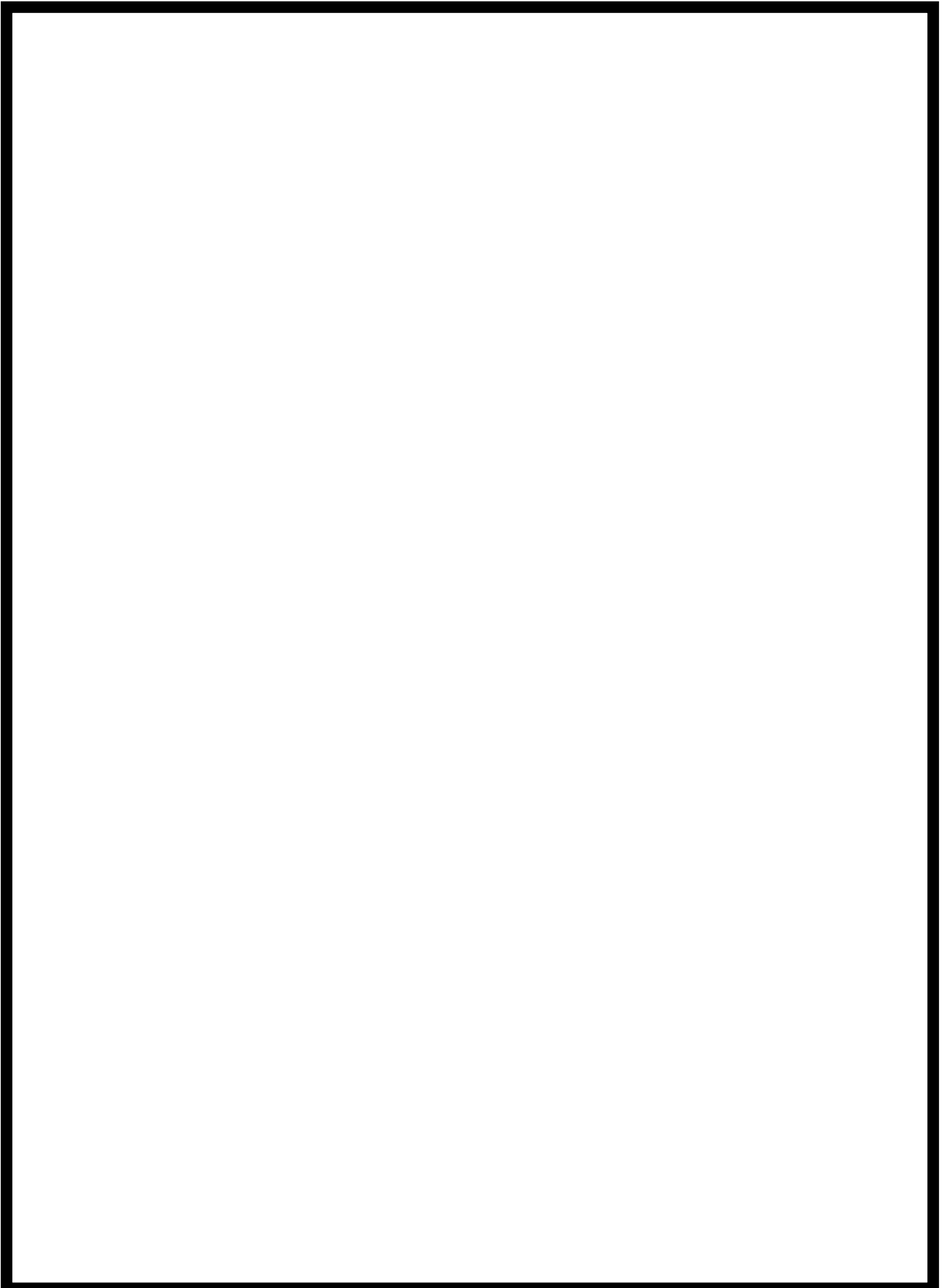


Step 4.

Art Know How

- Three dimensional pastel shapes
- Toning facial features



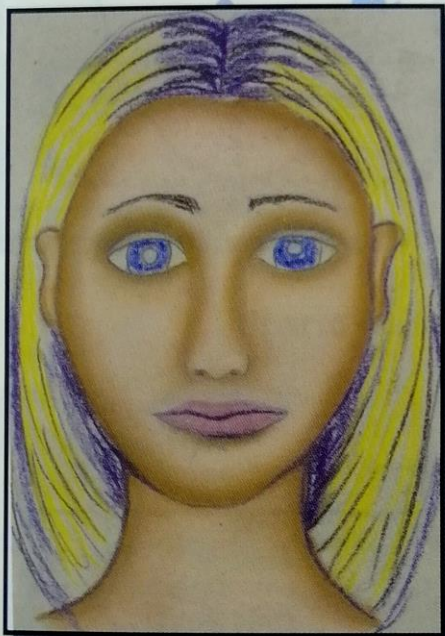
Step 1.

- Use the portrait drawing completed in the planning stages of this unit.
- Remind students to erase all the guidelines before applying the chalk pastel.



Step 2.

- Choose a dark and light skin coloured pastel. Thickly outline all the dark areas of the face with the dark pastel.
- Carefully apply the light chalk pastel over the remaining areas of the face. Using small circular movements, firmly blend the dark pastel into the highlight areas.



Step 3.

- Add a colour to the lips, an iris colour to the eye and mark in the eye brows with a colour to match the hair colour.
- To create more contrast in the face,

add a little purple around the face, neck, nostrils and in the lip part.

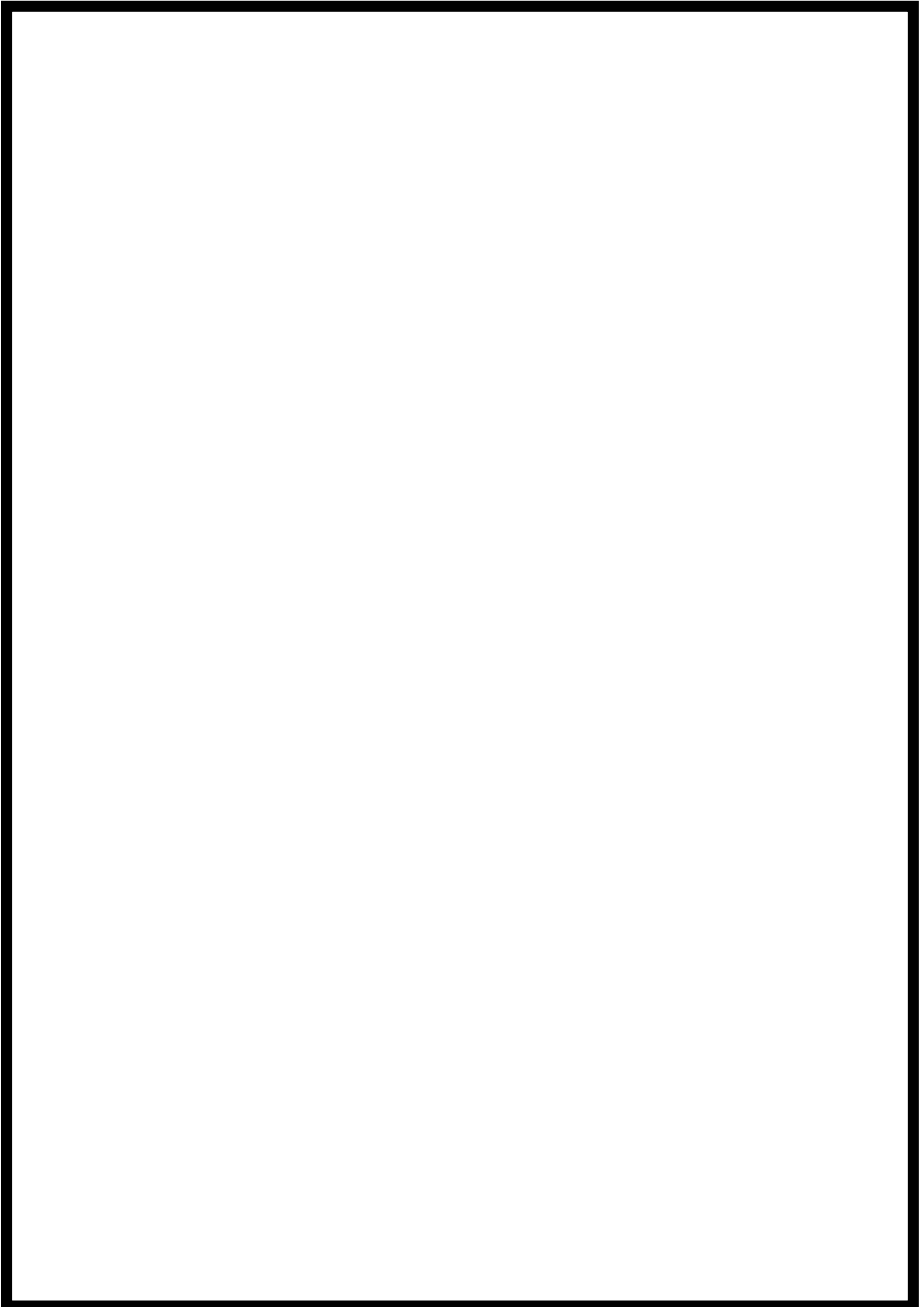
- Add streaks of purple in the darkest areas of the hair and then fill the remaining areas with the preferred hair colour.

Step 4.

- Smudge all the colours to create a soft effect.
- Use purple to mark in the eye lashes and to fill in the pupil.
- To create more contrast, students may like to smudge a little white pastel in the highlight areas of the face and add white streaks to the hair.

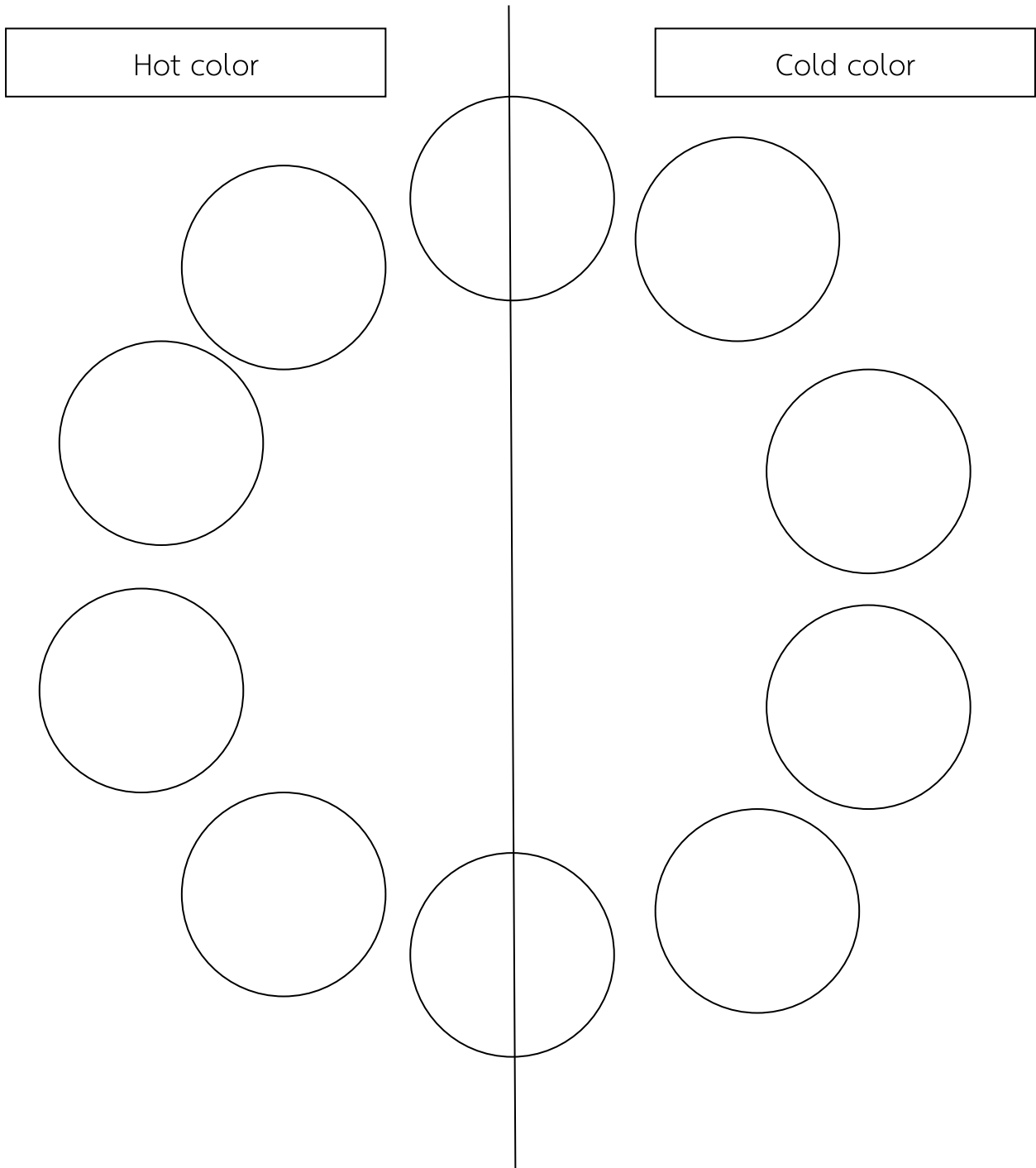

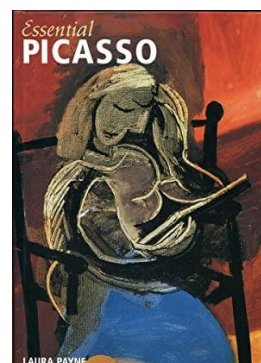

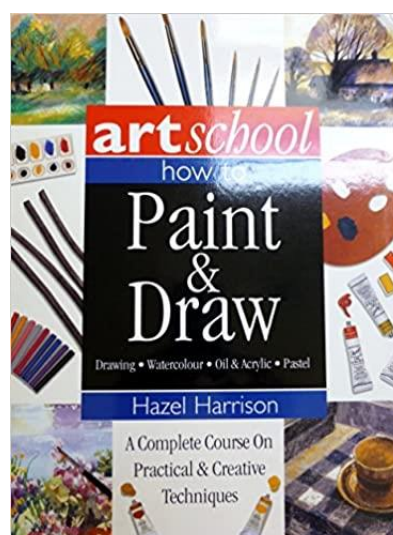
