The **Present Perfect Tense** is formed using the following structure:

**Affirmative:** Subject + Have / Has + Past Participle

**Negative:** Subject + Haven't / Hasn't + Past Participle

**Question:** Have / Has + Subject + Past Participle

### **Affirmative Sentences**

Subject	Have	Past Participle	Rest of the Sentence
I	have	studied	for the exam.
You	have	bought	a new computer.
He	has	eaten	my chocolate.
She	has	written	an e-mail.
It	has	been	cold this month.
We	have	won	the championship.
You	have	tried	to learn a lot.
They	have	forgotten	my birthday.

**Negative Sentences** The contraction of the perfect tense in negative form is:  
Have not = Haven't / Has not = Hasn't

Subject	Have	Past Participle	Rest of the Sentence
I	haven't	studied	for the exam.
You	haven't	bought	a new computer.
He	hasn't	eaten	my chocolate.
She	hasn't	written	an e-mail.
It	hasn't	been	cold this month.
We	haven't	won	the championship.
You	haven't	tried	to learn a lot.
They	haven't	forgotten	my birthday.

### Present Perfect and Past simple: time expressions

We use the present perfect with: **ever**, **never** (any time/not any time)

Have you **ever** seen a lion?

I've **never** seen a lion.

just (a short time ago)

Is Peter here? No, he's **just** gone out. There he is!

**yet (not finished - with negatives and questions)**

I haven't finished **yet**.

Have you finished your homework **yet**?

**already ( finished )**

Have a sandwich?

No thanks, I've **already** eaten.

### Since and For

We use for and since with the present perfect to talk about how long the action or situation existed from the past to the present.

We use **for** to talk about a length of time

we use **since** to talk about when a period of time began.

### For Since

**for** : four years, six months , five days, three hours, twenty minutes

a minute , a long time

**since** : 1990 , last year, (last) June , (last) Friday, yesterday , this morning,  
nine o'clock ,this morning
